

## **VIZARTS: New works find Freedom**

FREEDOM PARK is the place to be Sunday afternoon, when the Art in Freedom Park exhibition welcomes 12 new sculptures. That brings the total to 33 sculptures, which are installed across 2 miles of bike and walking trails on the East-West leg from Glen Iris to Candler Park.

Look for --- not that you could miss --- Michael Murrell's 12-foot-tall blue metal canoes that are really line drawings in the sky. Picnic amid the flowers and the clay oval sculptures of Pandora Williams' installation. (Don't let knowing that the ovals are based on fungi cells spoil your lunch.) Play Mario Schambon and George Long's 16-foot-long xylophone. Romp through Lindsay Walsworth's hoops. Then, catch your reflection on the stainless steel panels Etienne Jackson has installed among the trees.

Artists use photography, poetry and cellphones (yours) as materials. And even light: Jeffry Loy's "Light of 1000 Souls" is a 12-foot-tall stainless steel sculpture featuring 144 solar-powered spheres that emit a swirl of colored light.

OPENING DAY PERFORMANCES are from 2-9 p.m. on Freedom Park hill (Moreland Avenue and Druid Place) and include: Dance and live music by Hungry Flower, Sarai and Diana Obscura; funk-jazz artist Asa Nisi Masa; Atlanta Poets Group; Rob Rushin, playing multiple layered guitars, a la Robert Fripp; Mr. Boom, reciting poetry and monologues.

Also, there'll be a fire spinning performance by members of the Atlanta troupes Fahrenheit and the Fire McGees.
